


Chace Mindel

Thanks Chace for your interest in volunteering to help out Greenville.




Total Number of Calls




Time of Day






Call by Type

Active shooter

We are the first EMR group to start training with Outagamie County Sheriff's Department that will be tasked with rescuing victims from an active shooter incident. The pictures show the protective equipment we will need to help with the rescue. It includes a helmet and bullet proof vest. These cost right around \$1300.00 a set. We'll also carry medical supplies like tourniquets, bandages, etc. We will be escorted by the officers, with guns drawn, to get victims out as soon and as quickly as possible.
