Fact Sheet & Summary

By the Numbers - Needs Assessment

Park and recreation needs may include the demand for additional park land to accommodate new facilities, requirements for additional parks in areas where new residential growth is occurring, or the need for new or improved park facilities and equipment.

LEVEL OF SERVICE STANDARDS*:

- Park Land Need: 10 acres per 1,000 residents
- Facility Need: 1 facility per 3,000 residents
- Jurisdictional Requirements:
 - State: 70 acres per 1,000 residents
 - County: 15 acres per 1,000 residents
 - Local: 7-10.5 acres per 1,000 residents
 - Private: 5 acres per 1,000 residents

Developed in conjunction with the Park Commission, Town Board, and various interested local organizations and citizens, this new plan continues a planning process which historically has served as a guide for the future development of Greenville's park and recreation system.

Mission of the Parks & Rec Department:

Improve the Quality of Life for all of Greenville's residents and visitors by providing and promoting well-maintained parks, recreational facilities, open space, and urban forest.





Highlights & Statistics

Goals of the CORP:

- ✓ Provide a well-planned & diverse recreational system
- ✓ Preserve environmental resources
- ✓ Gather public support
- ✓ Encouraging healthy livability
- ✓ Provide ADA accessible sites are main objectives

Current Parks & Rec:

- ✓ The Town maintains 10+ parks an approximate total of 211 acres, 2,500 trees in the urban forest and 3 miles of trails (on-street & off road).
- ✓ Favorite parks - Lion's and Jennerjohn were the top 2 followed by the privately owned Special Memories Zoo and the YMCA.
- ✓ Most used facilities within the town were the playgrounds, picnic areas & shelters, sledding hill, ball diamonds, and soccer fields.

General Recommendations

- ✓ Improve access to Parks from Neighborhoods with safe trail connections.
- ✓ Develop a separate Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan.
- ✓ Inspect Playgrounds Annually
- ✓ Maintain Landscaping & Beautification projects
- ✓ Renovate existing shelters
- ✓ Install consistent park signage at all parks.
- ✓ Purchase additional land when feasible.
- ✓ Create a Master Plan for all parks.
- ✓ Consider a swimming or splashpad area at Jennerjohn
- ✓ Create a dog park
- ✓ Consider a plan for the farmer's market with added green space.
- ✓ Continue with tree plantings. (Tree USA ordinance)

Key Priority Projects

Jennerjohn Park:

- Renovate the existing shelter
- Install a splashpad

Community Park:

- Renovate the existing shelter
- Add an enclosure for the dumpster

Lion's Park:

- Expand trail to the south
- I.D. and eradicate invasive species

Greenville Sports Complex:

- Add signage
- Create a heritage garden concept plan

Pebbleridge Park:

- I.D. and eradicate invasive species
- Add trail signage

Glen Valley Park:

- Plant more trees for shade

Glen Valley West Park:

- Add play equipment
- Add a basketball court

Appletree Square:

- Install a picnic table

Kimberly Court:

- Install a park signage
- Add arboretum plantings

Trails:

- Expand the **CB trail** north from Highway 96 to 15.
- Connect the **Design Drive trail** west to Highway 76 and east to CB.
- Connect a trail from Lion's Park to the new Greenville Sports Complex.
- Expand the **Parkview Drive trail** east to the Amber Woods Property and west from Ridgway to Highway 96.
- Extend the **Highway 76 trail** north to Glen Valley Park and add a connection to NGES.
- Create a trail in **Community Park** along the backside of the ball diamonds.
- Connect **Highway 96** to Greendale Road.
- Link **Highway 15 trail** to Hortonville.
- Link to College Ave. via **N. Mayflower** and McCarthy Roads.

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
