Dear Greenville Citizens,

The sun is staying up longer, the days are getting warmer, and everything is turning green again. Farmers are busy readying for another planting season, tulips are blooming, trees are budding, and children throughout Greenville are warming up for another baseball or softball season. The Town of Greenville has reorganized its Facilities Committee, is preparing for projects planned for execution in 2016, and is busy planning for improved services throughout the community. Spring is definitely in the air.

The Greenville Facilities Committee (GFC) is in the process of reorganizing its membership with five new citizen members recently appointed to the now eleven member Committee. It is the responsibility of this Committee to review the results of the November referendum and take the opportunity to listen to opinions and concerns of Greenville residents regarding facility improvement projects proposed during the referendum process. The GFC is challenged with identifying the true requirements of a rapidly growing community, analyzing alternatives for meeting the needs of Greenville, and recommending a solution that will successfully serve our Town now and many years into the future. To ensure you continue to be informed about the progress this Committee makes you are invited to attend their open meetings (contact the Town Hall for upcoming meeting dates or watch the Events Calendar on the Town website) and encouraged to review the mate-

rials presented by the committee on the Town website.

As the many outdoor home projects begin to get checked off your to-do lists you will also notice the Town doing the same. Many people have approached me asking about the construction project taking place located just north of Lions park on Hwy 76. This project is a necessity to providing water, sewer, and storm water run-off services to new subdivisions, which are designed to include over 100 new home sites, being constructed on the east side of Hwy 76. Many projects are planned for our area parks including improvements to the Jennerjohn park ball field & tennis courts, the addition of a shooting platform for the archery range at Lions Park, and general improvement projects to all Greenville parks. Our Public Works Department will be assisting the Parks & Recreation Department with the construction of additional parking at Community Park after the Greenville Youth Sports seasons are complete. Repairs to the Airport water tower to bring it back into operation have been approved and are planned to be initiated in 2016.

A large rainfall event in June of 2015 demonstrated the need to design and construct regional ponds and rain gardens to help with flooding issues. The Town Board with the assistance of Chris Pagels, Town of Greenville Storm Water Utility Superintendent, reviewed the many concerns and issues identified by citizens of Greenville as a result of this significant rainfall event. Board has approved necessary actions to allow for engineering and design efforts to take place and will be reviewing the recommended solutions as they are brought forward for approval. Some of these solutions may include reconstruction current retention ponds or the purchase of land and construction of retention ponds in new areas of concern. In addition to work being done on local retention ponds, the Town will be continuing efforts to gain approval from state agencies to dredge streambed locations in the Bear Creek/ Everglade Swamp Watershed allowing for downstream relief of storm water run-off issues.

The Town of Greenville continues to be one of the fastest growing municipalities in the state. Over the past 15 years the population of Greenville has more than doubled to over 11,000 residents. This rapid increase is not without its challenges. In order to maintain the high-level of service the Town is known for the number of Town employees has grown from 9 to 25 full-time employees. These employees are busying planning for our future. Current planning efforts include:

- Election facility review - based on the number of registered voters in Greenville, the election process must be revamped and this includes an in-depth analysis of the election facility needs. The Town Hall does not allow for the now over 7,000 registered voters in one location. We will be looking at the addition of a second polling location. With the addition of a polling location, we will need additional election workers.
- Recreational paths/lanes – with the increased use of Town roadways for recreational purposes the Town will continue to examine opportunities for expanding our current trail system. The Town is currently seeking grants that will help fund new recreational trail projects along Cty CB as well as Julius Drive. Many other recreational trail projects continue to be considered.

- Brush drop off site – The growth of our community is pushing the limitations of our current brush site drop-off area. We are currently working to identify a variety of alternatives that will help alleviate an often congested location.
- Greenville Sports Complex (Field of Dreams) comprehensive plan – Our Park's Commission has recently been asked by the Town Board to analyze the existing comprehensive plan for the Greenville Sports Complex. Many groups and organizations will be asked to participate in the needs analysis for the site to ensure we are creating a plan for all of Greenville.

As we pass into the season of spring I encourage all of you to come and enjoy the wonderful parks throughout Greenville. Come and participate in Greenville Facilities Committee meetings as well as any other open Town meeting. Don't forget to mark your calendars for Greenville's upcoming summer events:

- **Farmers Market** - every Wednesday afternoon starting at the beginning of June thru the end of September located on the NW corner of Hwy. 76 & Parkview Dr.
- **Community Movie Night** - at Lions Park June 8, June 22, July 13, July 27, August 10 and August 24.
- **Catfish Extravaganza** - July 8 (Community Night) & July 9 (Concert featuring Lynyrd Skynyrd and Joan Jett, get your tickets soon!)
- **Summer Send-off Parade & Bill Tesch Memorial Concert** – August 27.
- **Greenville Youth Sports** – Come down to Community Park to take in a ball game!



## Wisconsin Now Requires a Photo ID to Vote

- ✓ Do I have the right photo ID?
- ✓ How do I get a Free State ID card?
- ✓ Are there exceptions to the new law?
- ✓ What can I expect at the polling place?

### **There is not a separate “Voter ID” card.**

There are many forms of Photo ID, which you may already have, that can be used to vote. Anyone with a valid Wisconsin driver license or Wisconsin state ID card, or any of the documents listed below, already has the photo ID they need for voting purposes. The following photo IDs are acceptable for voting purposes, and can be unexpired or expired after the date of the most recent general election (currently, the November 4, 2014 election):

- o A Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended
- o A Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card
- o Military ID card issued by the U.S. Uniformed Services
- o A U.S. passport book or card

The following photo IDs are also acceptable for voting purposes:

- o A certificate of naturalization (that was issued not earlier than two years before the date of the election)
- o An identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin
- o A driver license receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
- o An identification card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
- o A photo identification card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college, or technical college that contains the following: Date the card was issued, signature of the student, expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance, the university or college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves enrollment, such as a tuition fee receipt, enrollment verification letter, or class schedule

**An acceptable Photo ID for voting does not have to include a current address.**

**Wisconsin ID cards used for voting are FREE.**

If you are a U.S. citizen, will be at least 18 years of age by the next election, and would like a Wisconsin ID card to vote, please check the ID for FREE box when completing the Wisconsin Identification Card (ID) application MV3004 or apply on line with the DMV. A Document Verification Petition Process is available if fees arise in order to obtain a free ID card for voting. This petition process is available if any of the following applies:

1. Applicant is unable to provide documents for proof of name and date of birth, but which require a fee to a government agency to obtain. This includes documentation needed for proof of legal name change.
2. Applicant is unable to provide documents for proof of US citizenship, but which require a fee to a government agency to obtain.

A free ID card is NOT available under the following circumstances:

1. If you currently have a valid unexpired driver license, you are not eligible under Wisconsin law to obtain an ID.
2. If you will not be at least 18 years of age on the date of the next election.
3. If you are not eligible to vote in Wisconsin.

**There are exceptions to the new law.** Most Wisconsin voters will need to show an acceptable photo ID to vote. It's the new law. But for some absentee voters and those with a sincere religious belief against being photographed, there are exceptions that may mean you don't need a photo ID.

For absentee voters the rules are simple:

1. If you're in the military, live permanently overseas or are classified as a confidential elector, you don't need a photo ID to cast your absentee ballot.
2. There are also accommodations in the law for absentee voters who cannot make it to a polling place because they are indefinitely confined, or live in a nursing home or care facility. These voters do not need to show their photo ID, but other rules do apply.

Religious exceptions:

If you wish to obtain an ID for voting purposes, but have spiritual beliefs which prevent you from being photographed, you can receive a State ID card without a photo at any Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) office.

### **What to Expect at the Polling Place:**

Now that people are bringing their IDs to the ballot, voting at your polling place will be a little different. Just remember to be patient; not everyone will be as prepared for these changes as you are.

### **STATE IT**

As always, you'll need to state your full name and address for the election official who checks you in.

### **SHOW IT**

Next, it's time to show your photo ID. That way, poll workers can compare your face to your photo and confirm that you really are you. The address on your ID doesn't have to be current. And the name on your ID doesn't need to be an exact match for your name in the poll book.

### **SIGN IT**

Finally, you'll sign the poll book (unless a physical disability prevents it) Your signature or mark should go right next to your name and address.

# OUTAGAMIE COUNTY DISTRICT #28 UPDATE

Welcome sunshine and warm weather! Forgive me because I am going to talk about snow and snow removal for this update.

As many of you know the Outagamie County Highway Department is responsible for the maintenance and snow removal on the County roads and State highways that run through Greenville. I would like to apologize for the snow removal and salting on Highway 15 during the first two snow events of the season. I listened to the safety concerns from Greenville residents regarding this situation. I agreed with the concerns and opinions expressed that something was different in the snow removal efforts compared to previous years. I contacted County Executive Tom Nelson to pass along these concerns. After this discussion we worked together with County Highway Commissioner Dean Steingraber to extend the hours of coverage on this highway. I believe these efforts paid off and I was pleased by the results through the remainder of the snow removal season. I would like to thank them both for their help improving this situation.

Commissioner Steingraber and I feel there is more that can be done to keep Highway 15 as safe as possible during the winter months. Let me explain. The Wisconsin State Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is responsible for creating the maintenance plans and making the decisions for the level of service on the State highways that run through Greenville. These include highways 76, 96 and 15. WisDOT then contracts with the County Highway Department for the labor and equipment to execute these plans and carry out these decisions. State Highway 15 is currently only deemed necessary for 24-hour snow removal coverage in certain areas. These areas currently do not include the road miles between Greenville and Hortonville.

On March 7th I attended the Outagamie Highway Committee meeting. WisDOT representatives were in attendance to give an update to highway projects occurring in Outagamie County. I expressed my concerns that Highway 15 did not have 24-hour coverage for snow removal. Representatives from WisDOT explained to me that there are only so many maintenance dollars in the budget. Greenville has to compete with areas like Milwaukee and Madison for extra maintenance dollars. I asked them to take into consideration not only traffic counts but the age of drivers on this highway. We have a unique situation with the High School located in Hortonville. Many younger less experienced drivers travel these road miles to get to Hortonville High School. I explained that many school activities begin earlier than the school day begins. I also explained that many after school activities have buses coming back to the High School later

than 10 o'clock at night. After getting off the bus, the students then get into their cars and drive back to Greenville. These situations, both morning and night occur frequently on the weekends as well. Representatives from WisDOT told the Committee they would look into this request and follow up with a meeting with Commissioner Steingraber.

WisDOT maintained that they have a good relationship with Outagamie County and would like to continue this relationship. They value citizen input and it would be helpful to have input from citizens expressing support for increased maintenance efforts on Highway 15 from Greenville to Hortonville. They also informed the Committee that due to budget constraints, the Highway 15 Hortonville bypass project is not scheduled to begin until 2019. This means a minimum of three more winters with congested traffic between Greenville and Hortonville. This is where I need your help. Let me hear your opinions regarding a move toward 24-hour snow removal service on Highway 15 from Greenville to Hortonville. If you think the current level of service is acceptable let me hear that as well. I appreciate all input on this topic. The planning for the upcoming winter season is beginning now. Please email or write a letter and send it to me. I will pass it along to WisDOT representatives for this area. Emails must include citizen name and address and letters need to have your signature to be accepted as citizen input.

My goal is to always provide the citizens of District #28 with the information they need to make decisions and then to listen to their responses. # BUILDING INSPECTION DEPARTMENT

## BUILDING PERMIT CLARIFICATION

We feel a need to inform homeowners that the building permit taken out for the principal structure is only for what was submitted with the plans. Most likely this did not include finishing the basement, deck, or any other item not on the approved permit. Failure to obtain a building permit can result in double fees and / or citations. If you have questions, you may call the Building Inspector, Dale Waala, at 757-5151, ext. 2.

## BUILDING PERMITS

Since the summer construction season is now upon us, residents are reminded that building permits are required for the following projects:

- Construction of any building (house, garage, shed, or any structure).
- Additions to any house or structure.
- Re-roofing.
- Fences.
- Decks, Porches, or Pergolas.
- Remodeling of any sort (including finishing any basement area, windows, or doors).
- Heating or air conditioning (new or replacement) including garage heaters.
- Electric work.
- Plumbing.
- Any moving or demolition of buildings.

Please plan ahead. The amount of time to issue any permit may take up to five (5) working days.

Failure to obtain a building permit can result in double fees and/or citations. We'd also like to make you aware that there have been issues arising at the time of home sales that have been caused by building permits not being pulled for work that has been done on the home. This has resulted in some sellers losing their buyers.

## DECK CODES CHANGE SIGNIFICANTLY

As of January 1st, 2016, the State of Wisconsin has made major changes to the deck construction codes. For more detailed information, please go to the Town website at [www.townofgreenville.com](http://www.townofgreenville.com) and look in the Building Inspection Department for the Guide on Deck Building which is labeled Appendix B Deck Information.

## RE-ROOFING PERMITS ARE REQUIRED

To provide some protection to homeowners and to reduce the number of uninsured contractors, the State requires that building contractors have proper licenses. A permit is required for any re-roofing job. A building permit application must be submitted along with the \$50.00 fee.

The roofing contractor should pull the building permit and will be required to show proof of current dwelling contractor and dwelling contractor qualifier licenses.

The roofing information that will be needed in addition to the normal permit information is:

- The brand, color, and warranty information for the shingles.
- Will old shingles be torn off?
- If not tearing off old shingles, how many layers currently exist that will be shingled over?
- Who is the contractor?





# Agricultural Enterprise Area News

Greenville farmers, area agribusiness representatives, government advocates and educators gathered on December 6<sup>th</sup> 2015 at Homestead Meadows for a celebration to commemorate the expansion of Greenville’s Agricultural Enterprise Area (AEA).

The potluck social was followed by informational sessions inside the vintage dairy barn converted in the 1980s to a special event venue. Participants enjoyed a great neighborly meal, as each brought a dish to share, with the main course and accommodations provided by the Nagy family.

The event celebrated the recent approval of a greater than three-fold expansion to our existing Agricultural Enterprise Area.

The expansion approved by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) officially went into effect on January 1st 2016. DATCP’s formal acceptance of our Land Stewardship Committee’s Phase II application expands our existing AEA further into the southwest and western regions of the Township. This advances our Committee’s goal to provide an agricultural greenbelt for present and future residents to enjoy, balancing residential development pressures resulting from our close proximity to the Fox Cities metro area.

The Phase II AEA expansion adds an additional 4839 acres to our original AEA, for a combined total of 6,228 acres. The new area extends west on Winnegamie Drive from Julius Drive, then north along Greendale Road (please refer to map).

Participating landowners voluntarily agree to designate their lands for agricultural use for 15 years.

Currently, there are 31 Agricultural Enterprise Areas in Wisconsin, comprising well over 1 million acres. Greenville's AEA is the smallest in total acres, but of much interest to DATCP due our close proximity to urban development pressures.





## YARD WASTE SITE HOURS AND POLICY

All Town of Greenville residents will need to obtain a 2016 windshield decal to enter the yard waste facility. No one will be allowed to drop off or pick up anything from the yard waste facility without a windshield decal. If a Town resident is using multiple vehicles to come into the yard waste facility, they will need to purchase multiple decals for each vehicle used. Windshield decals can be purchased at Town Hall or the Municipal Building offices. The cost of the windshield decals will be \$10 for the first decal and \$5 per vehicle after that for vehicles that reside at a single household. Permits are good for one year starting January 1 through December 31. Decals will need to be purchased each year the resident intends to use the yard waste site. The Town yard waste site is for Town of Greenville residents only. No commercial operators or businesses will be allowed into the site.

\*A windshield decal will NOT be needed to dispose of used oil and antifreeze.

## FREE TIRE DROP-OFF

The dates for the 2016 free tire drop-off are Monday April 11 – Wednesday April 20 and Monday September 12 – Wednesday September 21. Just a reminder that tires can only be brought to the Greenville Waste Site during this week. Tires will not be accepted at the Town during any other time, however can be dropped at the Outagamie County Landfill for a fee. Collection is limited to Town of Greenville residents only, with the limit of 4 tires per household. Tires from businesses are not accepted. Only tires that are 17" or less will be accepted at no charge. For all tires 18" or larger in size or a quantity of over 4, the resident will be charged \$4.00 per tire at the Town of Greenville Municipal Building; or \$150.00 per ton if taken directly to the Outagamie County Landfill/ Recycling Center (1419 Holland Rd, Appleton).

## OIL FILTER AND ABSORBENT RECYCLING

Effective January 1, 2011 oil filters and absorbents must be recycled. This applies to homeowners, farmers and businesses. Oil filters from cars, trucks, buses, motorcycles, snowmobiles, forklifts, tractors, ATV's and UTV's. More than one gallon of absorbents such as oil dry, rags, wipes, paper toweling, kitty litter, pillows, socks and pads must be recycled. Oil filters may be recycled at the Town of Greenville Yard Waste Site along with used oils and antifreeze. If there are an exceedingly high number of people on the list, your brush may not be picked up on Monday, but early in the week.

By pressing these numbers, you will be transferred to the cell phone of the person on call that week. These numbers are only for emergencies that are not able to wait until regular business hours for attention. If the situation can be dealt with during business hours the following day, please leave a detailed message with your name and number in the Public Works general mailbox by PRESSING 1 and someone will return your message as soon as possible.

## SAFETY TIPS FOR PEDESTRIANS

### Be Safe and Be Seen: Make yourself visible to drivers

- Wear bright/light colored clothing and reflective materials.
- Carry a flashlight when walking at night.
- Cross the street in a well-lit area at night.
- Stand clear of buses, hedges, parked cars, or other obstacles before crossing so drivers can see you.

### Be Smart and Alert: Avoid dangerous behaviors

- Always walk on the sidewalk. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic.
- Stay sober; walking while impaired increases your chance of being struck.
- Don't assume vehicles will stop. Make eye contact with drivers, don't just look at the vehicle. If a driver is on a cell phone, he or she may not be paying enough attention to drive safely.
- Don't rely solely on pedestrian signals. Look before you cross the road.
- Be alert to engine noise or backup lights on cars when in parking lots and near on-street parking space.

### Be Careful at Crossings: Look before you step

- Cross streets at marked crosswalks or intersections, if possible.
- Obey traffic signals such as WALK/DON'T WALK signs.
- Look left, right, and left again before crossing a street.
- Watch for turning vehicles. Make sure the driver sees you and will stop for you.
- Look across ALL lanes you must cross and visually clear each lane before proceeding. Even if one motorist stops, do not presume drivers in other lanes can see you and will stop for you.
- Don't wear headphones or talk on a cell phone while crossing.

### Safety Tips for Drivers

- Be Alert: Watch for pedestrians and bicyclists at all times.
- Scan the road and the sides of the road ahead for potential pedestrians or bicyclists.
- Before making a turn, look in all directions for pedestrians crossing or bicyclists coming up the road.
- Do not drive distracted or after consuming alcohol or other drugs.
- Do not use your cell phone while driving.

- Look carefully behind your vehicle for approaching pedestrians, especially small children, before backing up.
- For maximum visibility, keep your windshield clean and headlights on.

### Be Responsible: Yield to pedestrians at crossings and give bicyclists room

- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks, whether marked or unmarked.
- Yield to pedestrians when making right or left turns at intersections.
- Do not block or park in crosswalks.
- Allow time for bicyclists to traverse intersections.
- Treat bicyclists like slow moving cars: do not tailgate them and wait until traffic conditions allow you to pass safely.
- Slow down when passing bicyclists and give them three feet of space when passing.
- Check over your shoulder after passing a bicyclist before moving back into the lane.

### Be Patient: Drive the speed limit and avoid aggressive maneuvers

- Never pass/overtake a vehicle that is stopped for pedestrians.
- Obey speed limits and come to a complete stop at STOP signs.
- Use extra caution when driving near children playing along the street or older pedestrians who may not see or hear you.
- Always be prepared to stop for pedestrians.
- Don't blast your horn in proximity to bicyclists.
- Children and novice riders can be unpredictable; expect the unexpected.

## SAFETY TIPS FOR BICYCLISTS

- Always Ride with Traffic and Follow the Rules of the Road.
- You are better off riding with the flow of traffic, not against it. Crash data tells us that getting hit from behind is extremely unlikely.
- You are more predictable and visible to motorists, especially at intersections and driveways.
- Ride in a straight line, not in and out of cars, and use hand signals when turning and stopping.
- Obey traffic signs, signals, and lane markings and yield to traffic when appropriate, including pedestrians.

# PUBLIC WORKS

## Don't Ride on the Sidewalk

- Although you might think it's a safer option, motorists are simply not looking for bicyclists on the sidewalk, especially those riding against the direction of traffic.
- At every driveway and intersection, you are at greater risk of being hit by a motorist than if you were riding on the road with traffic.
- Pedestrians will thank you for riding on the road as well.
- Ride on the trail, paved shoulder, bike lane, or bike route. You still need to follow the rules of the road and watch out for your fellow travelers. Ride to the right, signal your turns, obey traffic signs and signals.

## Be Predictable and Visible

- Try not to be hesitant or do things that motorists and other travelers may not be expecting.
- Make sure everyone can see you and knows where you are and where you are going.
- If riding in the dark, use headlights, taillights, and reflectors and wear reflective materials and brightly colored clothing.

- Do not wear headphones or talk on a cell phone while bicycling.

## Watch for Stuff on the Road or Trail that Might Make you Fall or Swerve

- Rocks, trash, storm grates, wet leaves, potholes, gravel, railroad tracks, and even wet pavement markings can all send you flying.
- Also watch for parked cars, doors opening, and cars pulling in and out of driveways.

## Watch for Turning Traffic

- Most car/bike collisions happen at intersections and driveways when motorists or bicyclists are turning.
- At every intersection and driveway, keep a careful eye out for motorists turning right in front of you, you may be going faster than they think. Also, look for motorists turning left across your path, drivers are looking for gaps in traffic and may not be paying attention to anything other than other motor vehicles.



## DISCONTINUATION OF SUMMER SPRINKLER CREDIT

As Greenville continues to rapidly grow we need to look at other methods of water conservation. The motion made in 2001 to allow for discounted rates for summer watering and the filling of swimming pools **has been rescinded** by the Sanitary District Commissioners. As of October 6, 2015 there will **no longer be a summer sprinkler credit**. We are already running water dangerously low and are close to exceeding capacity. Therefore we had no choice but to remove watering forgiveness to preserve water. Many residents take advantage of the discounted rates for summer watering, using valuable drinking water, to do miscellaneous projects around the yard. We are hoping that by discontinuing this process residents will be more cautious of how much water they are using outdoors during the summer months. We encourage more people to use rain barrels or even using sump pump water rather than using drinking water to water their lawns.

Note: We will still allow for the practice of establishing a new lawn with a sprinkler credit of 30,000 gallons and give approximately two months to establish a lawn with new home construction.

Greenville Fire & EMS has been very busy since the last newsletter was distributed.

- Tim “Woody” Woods (29 years of service) and Jonathan Schlafer (5 years of service) retired from the Fire Department. Their service to this community and our Department will be sorely missed. Thank you to you and your families for your dedication over the years.

## SEASONAL SAFETY TIPS/INFORMATION

Thanks to everyone who shoveled out the snow around their fire hydrants this past winter. We do take notice of this when we are out an about. Doing that for us saves precious minutes in a real emergency.

With the coming of spring, we know everyone would like to get at cleaning up their yards. This is also about the time we get our most complaints on burning. Please remember the Town has a yard waste drop off site at the Greenville Public Works building. If you are burning brush in your yard, please be aware that some of your neighbors may have health issues with the smoke and odor. We currently do not have a burning ordinance, but there is a nuisance ordinance that can be enforced if someone calls to complain about the burning. We ask that you be considerate of the people around you. Please do not burn if there is a significant wind, do not leave the fire unattended, keep the burn pile at least 25 feet from a vehicle/structure, and have a means to extinguish the fire on hand. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources publication AM-196-96 and NR 429.04 of Wisconsin’s Administrative Codes describe what can/cannot be burned by home owners. They allow home owners to burn clean wood/brush and DRY leaves/clippings. Materials that MAY NOT be burned are:

- wet, combustible rubbish, such as wet cardboard or paper
- oily substances, such as oily or greasy rags, oil filters, etc.
- asphalt, such as asphalt shingles or tar paper
- plastics of any kind, including plastic bottles and plastic bags
- rubber products, including tires and hoses

Thank you again and please take advantage of the yard waste drop off site located at W6895 Parkview Dr. (behind the fire station). For more details please see the Public Works section of the newsletter or: <http://www.townofgreenville.com/dept-public-works>

**Additionally, commercial businesses, contractors, etc. are not allowed to perform any kind of open burning without a license obtained from the DNR.**

- Fuels for lawn and garden equipment, tools and vehicles should only be stored in approved containers.
- HVAC systems should be checked by a professional.
- Barbeque gas grills, including gas hoses, gas grill lines, and propane tanks, should be inspected prior to use.
- Remove any combustibles from around hot water tanks, clothes dryers and vents, and any heating equipment.
- Remove any lint buildup from clothes dryers.
- Windows should be checked to make sure they open and close properly, in case they are needed as exits.
- **Review and practice your family’s Fire Escape Plan.**
- **Smoke and CO detector batteries should be checked, and replaced twice a year (at daylight savings time). Replace your Smoke detectors if they are more than 10 years old. Replace CO detectors if they are more than 5 years old or per the manufacturer’s recommendations.**

# FIRST RESPONDERS

Hello all, this year started out busy for emergency calls, but with the beginning of March calls have lessened a bit. The First Responders at the end of February responded to 57 calls, which was actually the same number we had in February 2015, so no better or worse but we would always like to have less.

In December all First Responders & EMT's had to take CPR recertification classes. These are both required every two years by law in order for us to keep our state licenses. Each CPR class is 4 hours long, the First Responder class is a total of 20 hours and EMT recertification is 28 hours. We are happy to say we all passed and are ready to help the Town of Greenville residents when the need arises.

So with winter finally behind us and warmer weather coming our way we thought we would offer everyone some summertime tips.

## Swimming Pool Safety

- Always keep the pool door closed and latched.
- When children are in or near the water, a grown up should watch them carefully. Do not take your eyes off them.
- If you have a pool party, have grown ups take turns watching the children at all times.
- Never swim alone. Even adults should swim with a buddy.
- Learn how you would save someone in trouble. Learn first aid and CPR. Make sure that anyone who cares for your children learns CPR.
- Keep poolside rescue equipment and a cordless, water resistant phone close to the pool area.
- Post emergency numbers and CPR instructions near the pool area.
- The pump in a pool or spa creates powerful suction at the drain which can trap a swimmer under water. Teach children to stay away from drains, grates and filters.

- Tie up long hair before swimming.
- Never leave toys in or around the pool when you are not around.
- Completely remove pool covers before anyone gets in.
- Stay out of pools during severe weather and thunder storms, especially if lightning is forecast or present.

## Grilling Safety

- Before using, place your grill at least 10 feet away from other objects, including the house and any shrubs and bushes.
- Always stay by the grill when cooking.
- Only use starter fluid made for barbecue grills when starting a fire in a charcoal grill.
- Before using a gas grill, check the connection between the propane tank and the fuel line to be sure it is working properly and not leaking.
- Never use a match to check for leaks. If you detect a leak, immediately turn off the gas and repair.
- Never bring a charcoal grill inside your home or garage. This is both a fire and carbon monoxide poisoning hazard.
- Keep kids and pets well away until grill equipment is completely cool.

## Lawn mower safety

Here are some things to consider wearing when you mow:

- Earplugs and Goggles.
- Footwear with good traction.
- Tight-fitting clothing (long pants and long sleeve shirts).
- Riding mowers are unstable on steep inclines. So unlike with walk behind mowers, with which you cut across an incline, with riders you should mow up and down the slope.
- Treat the operation of a riding mower as seriously as you would the operation of a car. Consequently, no kids (not even as passengers) allowed.
- When using a walk behind mower check the lawn first for objects that shouldn't be there like bottles, stones, etc. Propelled objects can cause serious injuries.
- Check that lawn mower guards and shields are in place. Set wheel height prior to starting the engine.
- If you are using a bag attachment, turn the mower off prior to removing or reattaching the bag.

- In summer mow in the evening for the sake of the grass but for your sake, early enough that there's still plenty of light by which to see.
- Mow only when the grass is dry, to reduce risk of injury due to slipping.
- Very steep slopes are dangerous to mow. Consider planting something other than grass.
- If you are truly concerned about lawn mower safety, reel mowers are the best because they use human power.

As a reminder to all parents and kids alike when walking on all roadways you should always walk on the shoulder facing oncoming traffic and when riding bikes you should also be on the shoulder but riding with the traffic and in single file. There have been several accidents in the Greenville area because these rules are not being followed.



# GREENVILLE CONSTABLE

Spring has arrived and with it comes the renewal of our surroundings. We see brown turn to green, the bare trees to blossoms and a beautiful array of colors in the flowers that bloom.

As the earth renews its promise of another season I ask that those of us who are pet owners renew our commitment to being responsible pet owners. We can do this by providing the proper care and training of our pets and knowledge of and adherence to the animal related ordinances of the Town of Greenville.

I would ask that you take the time to read our Animal ordinances. They can be found on the Town website. Animal ordinances are found under Part II – General Legislation, Chapter 76.

I bring this to everyone's attention because this winter was an extremely busy one in the animal world. This Department saw a dramatic increase in barking dog complaints and dogs at large. Non-licensure of dogs has also increased.

It has always been my practice to make a face to face visit with the owner of a pet who I have observed in violation of an ordinance or that I have received a complaint about. Generally this has solved the problem. It appears that with this past winter the tides have turned. In over 45% of these first time calls I received one or more additional complaints or I observed that the behavior was being allowed to continue.

That being said beginning now there will be much stricter enforcement of the animal related ordinances. So, again I encourage you to become familiar with our animal related ordinances. If you have any questions, concerns or comments please feel free to call me, email me or shoot me a text message. I have many, many resources available to help you resolve whatever behavior problem your pet might have. I will be happy to help you.

I also want to remind all dog owners that 2016 Dog License tags are available at Town Hall. I also carry tags in the event that a dog needs to get a license after hours. You are required, by Statute, to have any and all dogs over the age of 5 months licensed by April 1st. Beginning April 1st late fees will apply. Late fees will not be assessed on dogs acquired after March 31st or on dogs that are not yet 5 months of age. I also want all pet owners to understand that if your dog or cat is caught running "at large" and has no identification on him or her, I will make a reasonable effort to locate an owner. I do not have the means of holding your pet beyond a reasonable length of time. Greenville does contract with

the Fox Valley Humane Association to safely house strays and "at large" animals. A fee is charged for the care that your pet receives while at the shelter. In order to reclaim your dog, you will need proof of current rabies vaccination and a current year dog license and cash or credit card for the reclaim fee. At this time Greenville does not require cats to be licensed, so if you are reclaiming your cat you will only be required to pay the reclaim fee.

I encourage you to contact me immediately if your pet goes missing. I can be reached by phone, email, or through the Lost Pets of Greenville Facebook page. You can also message me on my own FB page.

## **THE STORY...The story of Hope....**

It was a very late Friday night, the sky was clear, the air crisp and the temperature hovering near 0°F when a car pulled up to a driveway, someone got out, opened the back door, picked up what appeared to be a package from the seat, closed the door and placed the package near the vehicle parked in the driveway. They then got back in the car and drove away.

Many hours later that "package" was discovered and found to be a small black dog. This little dog appeared to be frozen to the driveway. He or she was attempting to move but could not. After a closer look it was determined that the dog needed immediate medical attention.

The dog was taken to Fox Valley Humane Association where it was found to have a below normal temperature, was considerably underweight, was missing much of its fur and had fresh open sores on its knees, possibly from trying to crawl somewhere warm. The look in this little ones eyes was that of defeat. We needed to change that.

Slow warming of the dog and a re-feeding plan were started. Small amounts of food were to be fed at more frequent than normal intervals. Instead of being housed in one of the larger runs this dog would be staying in a large, luxurious crate, with a warm water whoopee cushion under her blankets and lots of stuffed toys to snuggle with. The crate would be put in the office of a staff member so a better watch could be kept.

Over the next several days the dog's condition slowly improved. Standing for short periods of time and getting back to a regular feeding schedule were achieved by day 2. The light was returning to her eyes as well. It was at this point that a name needed to be given to this little fighter. She was given the name "Hope", as we could see the light of hope returning to her eyes, the hope that there were better days ahead, the hope that she would find the life and love that she deserved.

By day 3 Hope could walk, although wobbly, a short distance. She had also begun wagging her tail.

It was decided that Hope would greatly benefit from being in a home environment to finish her recovery. The staff member whose office Hope was calling home agreed to foster Hope in her home until her recovery was complete.

For the next several weeks she was brought to work and showered with love and attention while her wounds healed and her spirit soared. Each evening she went home with her foster mom to her foster family and learned from her foster dogs how to trust humans again and how great it was to be a dog again.

By week 3 she had gained back several pounds, her wounds were almost healed and she was getting sassy. It wouldn't be long before she was ready for adoption. After hearing Hope's story many applications had come in with requests to adopt Hope.

By week 4 the veterinary staff had given Hope a clean bill of health. She was spayed and brought up to date on her vaccinations. She was now ready for her forever home. Two days later Hope joined her forever family.

As of this writing, Hope continues to gain weight, grow new fur and her wounds are a thing of the past and she loves her people!

We will probably never know how or why Hope got to the poor condition she was found in but there are two things to take from this:

- If you think someone is neglecting, abusing or treating an animal in a cruel manner please report it to your Constable or local law enforcement agency. You can report it anonymously.
- If you have ever considered fostering an animal in need I hope this story convinces you to do so.

Enjoy the warm weather, it won't last long and I leave you with this..... "When humans act with cruelty we characterize them as 'animals', yet the only animal that displays cruelty is humanity" Anthony Douglas Williams

## PARKS OPEN MAY 1ST

The restroom facilities at the parks will open by May 1st. The parks are open year round so feel free to get out and enjoy them at any time. With a new season approaching please remember to follow these important rules. The safety and enjoyment of the parks involves the cooperation of everyone.

- Please deposit litter and recyclables in the appropriate receptacles.
- Do not park on the grass.
- Motorized vehicles are not allowed on the trails. This includes cars, four wheelers, snowmobiles, motorized scooters or any other device powered by an electric or gas motor.
- Park Hours are 7 a.m. – 10 p.m.
- Please leave hot ashes in the grills.
- Glass containers are not allowed in the parks.

- Pets are not allowed in the parks. Dogs may be walked on the trail if they are leashed and properly cleaned up after.

## VANDALISM POLICY

Vandalism has been a serious problem in the Greenville Parks as it has in many other communities. In response to this vandalism the Town Board adopted a policy regarding vandalism to Town owned properties. The Town takes this policy seriously and will enforce it so now is a good time for parents to review this with their children. The policy is as follows:

### POLICY REGARDING DAMAGES TO TOWN OWNED PROPERTY

#### Under 16: **Must appear in court**

Hand written apology to Park Commission and Town Board.

Restitution to be done with guidance of parent.

Community Service.

#### 16 to 18: **Must appear in court**

Hand written letter of apology to be published in Town newsletter (Name will not be used in newsletter).

Community Service (To be determined).

Restitution to be done under guidance of Town Employee

or

Fined according to damages done.

#### Over 18: **Must appear in court**

Handwritten letter of apology to be published in Town newsletter (Name will be included) and the local newspaper.

Community Service (To be determined).

Restitution to be done under guidance of Town Employee.

Required appearance at annual Town meeting to apologize to Town residents for damages done

or

Fined according to damages done.

Please note: All juveniles will be referred to the Juvenile Intake Office.



# Memorial Tree and Bench Program



This program provides the opportunity to donate a park bench or tree in honor or memory of a loved one. These benches or trees may be placed at any of the parks or along the trail system. Your donation to this program will not only provide a lasting memory but also help to beautify our parks and trails.



## Tree Program

The purchase of a memorial tree includes a 3" x 5" stainless steel plaque that will be installed at the base of the tree. The town will purchase and plant the tree and will maintain the tree for its lifetime.

The donor may express preference of location and species of the tree to be planted. The exact location and species of the tree, however, will be determined by town staff depending on needs and site conditions. We will work with you to find the ideal species and location for your tree.

## Bench Program

With the bench program the donor has the option of having a plaque installed on the backrest of the bench. Town staff will install the bench and a 3" x 5" stainless steel plaque if desired. The maintenance of the bench will be the Town's responsibility for the life of the bench.

The donor may express a preference to the location of the bench. It may be located at one of the parks or along the trail system. The exact location of the bench will be determined by Town staff depending on needs.

## **STREET TREES**

We will be planting shade trees along the streets of subdivisions that have curb and gutter this spring. The property owners of lots that are scheduled for planting will receive letters further detailing the planting process prior to planting. Along with this letter will be a detailed care sheet for the newly planted trees. If you receive a street tree in front of your home this spring, please follow these guidelines to help these trees get off to a good start. If you received a tree last spring, please continue to follow these guidelines. Proper care in the first few years after planting is very important for the establishment and health of the tree. If you have any questions about our street tree program or about your trees, feel free to give us a call at 757-7266.

## **NEIGHBORHOOD TREE PROGRAM**

The Greenville Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department has a program that allows homeowners to help fill in tree locations in the new subdivisions with curb and gutter. The funding for the street trees in many of the current subdivisions was provided by fees that were collected on a per lot basis at the time a building permit was issued. Depending on the subdivision, this fee may or may not provide enough funding to completely line the streets with trees, leaving some vacant planting sites. The neighborhood tree program provides homeowners the opportunity to fill in these vacant locations. The homeowner pays for the cost of the tree while the Town will pick up the cost of the planting. The

trees will be planted during the spring along with the normal street tree planting. For more information please call us at 757-7266.

## **LANDSCAPING IN THE RIGHT-OF-WAY**

The Town of Greenville has an ordinance that regulates landscaping within the Town right-of-way. This ordinance requires that a permit be obtained if one desires to perform any landscaping activities within the Town right-of-way. The Town right-of-way typically extends 33' out from the centerline of the road which usually amounts to 15' from the curb. If you are unsure of the location of the right-of-way, please contact Town Hall. This new ordinance only applies to subdivisions with curb and gutter. Landscaping is still prohibited in any Town ditch. In order to receive a permit, one must fill out an application and submit a landscape plan that adheres to the regulations set forth by the ordinance. If you are planning to do any landscaping in the right-of-way, please stop by Town Hall and pick up a permit application and a copy of the ordinance. This may also be viewed on the Town Website. Violators of this ordinance will be subject to a fine and removal of any landscaping that violates the regulations set forth by this ordinance.

## **URBAN FORESTRY BOARD**

The Greenville Urban Forestry Board currently has open positions available on the Board. The Urban Forestry Board is a group of residents that oversee the operation of Greenville's Urban Forestry program. The Board plans and implements tree planting projects in Town, oversees the forestry budget, provides forestry education to the public, etc. Meetings are held at the Town Hall on the second Thursday of months of January, March, May, July, September and November at 6:30 pm. If you are interested in a position on the Urban Forestry Board, join us at a meeting or contact Tony Nowak, Director of Parks and Forestry.

## SEASONAL EMPLOYMENT

The Greenville Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department will be accepting applications through spring for Seasonal Park Maintenance Worker positions. There may be both long-term and short-term positions available. The long-term positions will work from April through October. Weekly hours will depend on weather and workload with a maximum of 1000 hours for the year. This position will be primarily responsible for mowing in the parks. Qualified candidates must also be able to perform routine maintenance on the mowing equipment including greasing, cleaning and

changing and sharpening the blades. The short-term positions work 40 hours per week through the months of June, July and August. These positions are responsible for all aspects of park maintenance including mowing, trimming, trash pick-up, restroom cleaning, etc. Applications and complete position descriptions are available on the Town website.

## FIELD OF DREAMS PARK


