Happy summer Greenville!

Welcome to the warm, beautiful months of summer. The season holds endless opportunities to create a lifetime of memories. It's a time to get out, meet a new neighbor, discover a new place, or simply enjoy a new summer recipe. Of course we can't forget about our old favorites. As the citizens are celebrating a much deserved summer, the employees at the Town of Greenville are focusing on safety, recreational trail development, park improvements, and the needs of the community.

Summer is a time when the children of Greenville are free of their daily school activities and evening homework responsibilities. Meaning they are outside playing more, so remember to slow down as you drive on our roadways. The ideal modes of transportation of our youth are their feet or their bicycles. Children don't always remember to stop, look, and listen before crossing the street. Parents should remind their children about proper techniques for crossing the street as well as bicycle safety ensuring helmets are not only worn, but fit properly. Adults need to remember to set the right example and also follow bicycle and recreational safety guidelines. As you do get out and adventure around Town note many of the rural roadways were designed and built 70 or more years ago. Be mindful of common factors contributing to accidents:

- Narrow two-lane roadways
- Dangerous nighttime conditions

- Relatively high vehicle speeds
- Absence of shoulders along the roadway (and other space constraints)

Fortunately the Town of Greenville has received notification from the state we will be receiving funds through the Town Road Discretionary Improvement Program (TRID) allowing for the widening of Julius Drive (Spring Road to School Road). The widening for this section of Julius Drive will allow for 2 recreational lanes to be added to the roadway. The current timeline consists of engineering and design work to be completed in 2016 with construction being performed in 2017. Additional future trail expansion being reviewed include:

- Cty CB – Wisconsin Ave to Levi Dr.
- School Road – Hwy 76 to Julius Drive
- Design Drive – Cty CB to Hwy 76
- Hwy 76 tunnel by Lions Park - no time line, will occur in conjunction with repairs to Hwy 76 so closure of the road would happen at the same time
- Future Hwy 15 bypass project – to include a recreational trail from Lily of the Valley Drive to Manley Road
- Future Hwy 76 Urbanization – Everglade Road to Cty JJ and Hwy 76 to North Greenville Elementary

Town employees are busy preparing and maintaining our local parks. In addition to mowing the grass and general maintenance of the facilities the Town

is working to improve features including the Jennerjohn Park ballfield & tennis courts and continuing construction of the shooting platform for the archery range at Lions Park. The Town of Greenville Park & Recreation Department and Park Commission are working to update the master plan for Greenville Sports Complex (a.k.a.: Field of Dreams). Many of our parks have beautiful pavilions available for use by the public (Community Park, Jennerjohn Park, and Lions Park). If you are wishing to utilize one of the magnificent park pavilions please contact the Park & Recreation Department (757-7276) to reserve a date.

Voter turnout for the 2016 Spring Election was tremendous, but also showed the limitations of the Town Hall as the only voting facility in Greenville for just over 7,000 registered voters. Shepherd of the Hills Church is being reviewed as a potential alternative as it allows for a much larger indoor facility, adequate parking, and handicap accessibility. Approval of a new location is expected in August. Additionally, further discussion will be held with the GIS department prior to any formal resolution being approved to determine an appropriate division of wards.

## JIM BEARD RETIRES

Outagamie County owes a debt of gratitude to the recently retired Jim Beard. Under his tutelage, countless students have been given the opportunity to participate in a host of fascinating projects. For their efforts, we're all better off.

Jim founded Fox Valley Technical College's Horticulture Technician program. During his tenure at the college, he set a high standard of accomplishment.

Jim's philosophy could be summarized in a word: growth. He liked to tell his students, you're here to learn how to grow things; I'm here to grow you. He succeeded in spades.

He implemented the state's first sustainable greenhouse for instructional purposes, enabling plant growth around the clock, by way of a boiler system that heats the greenhouse floor.

He and his students developed the region's first hydroponics labs and a horticulture tissue lab, in conjunction with FVTC's expansion into its Service Motor Company Agriculture Center. Among its benefits, the hydroponics lab served as a community learning center for an autistic individual, who was able to refine both his motor and communication skills, while building confidence through a routine in this setting.

Under Jim's leadership, a group of students constructed a "green roof" rest station, a sustainable pergola with rooftop vegetation, an innovative drainage system and a deep-root anchor system to help it resist high winds. The structure earned a Gold Medal Award in 2008 from the Wisconsin Landscape Contractors Association.

Jim spearheaded the development of a reflection garden for Riverside Medical Center in Waupaca and built a path and arbor for the Outagamie County cemetery restoration initiative, and helped with a number of structural upgrades at local YMCAs and elementary schools.

Four years ago, he and his students led the design and landscaping for the 911 Memorial in Greenville. The site stands today as a worthy point of interest in western Outagamie County.

We are especially grateful to Jim for his work at Brewster Village. If you've had occasion to visit the facility, you know it's a five-star long-term care & rehabilitation center. Jim's unique contribution was to ensure that the exterior and landscaping perfectly complemented the site's first-class interior. Again, he succeeded above expectations.

You may want to check out *Growing People: How green landscapes and garden spaces can change lives* a worthwhile read that Mr. Beard penned in 2015, in partnership with Chris Jossart of FVTC.

# BUILDING INSPECTION DEPARTMENT

## BUILDING PERMIT CLARIFICATION

We feel a need to inform homeowners that the building permit taken out for the principal structure is only for what was submitted with the plans. Most likely this did not include finishing the basement, deck, or any other item not on the approved permit. Failure to obtain a building permit can result in double fees and / or citations. If you have questions, you may call the Building Inspector, Dale Waala, at 757-5151, ext. 2.

## DECK CODES CHANGE SIGNIFICANTLY

As of January 1st, 2016, the State of Wisconsin has made major changes to the deck construction codes. For more detailed information, please go to the Town website at [www.townofgreenville.com](http://www.townofgreenville.com) and look in the Building Inspection Department for the “Appendix B Deck Codes”.

## RE-ROOFING PERMITS ARE REQUIRED

To provide some protection to homeowners and to reduce the number of uninsured contractors, the State requires that building contractors have proper licenses. A permit is required for any re-roofing job. A building permit application must be submitted along with the \$50.00 fee.

The roofing contractor should pull the building permit and will be required to show proof of current dwelling contractor and dwelling contractor qualifier licenses.

The roofing information that will be needed in addition to the normal permit information is:

- The brand, color, and warranty information for the shingles.
- Will old shingles be torn off?
- If not tearing off old shingles, how many layers currently exist that will be shingled over?
- Who is the contractor?

## SHED GUIDELINES

### Items needed:

1. Permit Application – available at office or on Town website [www.townofgreenville.com](http://www.townofgreenville.com)
2. Proper Fees--Dependant on size of shed \$50.00 / \$100.00 / \$150.00 / \$250.00
3. Site Plan to include:
  - Setbacks to property lines – based on parcel zoning and building size
  - Distances to other structures
  - Location of septic system – if applicable
  - Location of well – if applicable
  - Drainage easements
  - Utility easements
4. Shed detail
  - Type of material
  - Floor plan & front elevation – blueprints or hand drawn sketch to include location of braced wall panels
  - Material sizes
  - Footings / foundation

### Items for Consideration:

1. Drainage easements
2. Utility easements
3. Shoreland Zoning
4. Airport Zoning
5. Wetlands
6. Property lines
7. Diggers Hotline 1-800-242-8511
8. Plan ahead for future (fences, additions, etc.)
9. Electrical needs
10. Heating needs – unvented gas heating systems and/or wood burning systems are **not allowed** in sheds, garages, barns, etc.

# SANITARY DISTRICT

## NOTICE TO PRIVATE WELL OWNERS IN THE SANITARY DISTRICT

For those of you that renewed your well permit back in the summer of 2011, your permit was renewed at that time for a period of five years and will expire on June 1st, 2016. Once again, before the June deadline arrives, you will need to choose to either renew the well permit or abandon the well. If you choose to renew your permit, you will be required to provide one(1) safe well test from a certified laboratory along with the \$10.00 permit fee. The permits will again be good for a period of five years, and they do transfer to the new owner of the property if there is a change in ownership during that period. If you choose to abandon your well, you (or the company that does the abandonment for you) must complete the DNR abandonment form, which will be kept on file both at the DNR office and the Town Hall.

Instead of mailing the annual “Consumer Confidence Report” this year, we have posted it on the Town’s webpage at [www.townofgreenville.com](http://www.townofgreenville.com) for you to view at your own convenience. By providing an electronic copy in lieu of mailing, the Sanitary District saved approximately \$2,000 in material, printing, postage, and labor costs! However, if you would still prefer that a copy be mailed to you directly, please call Lisa at 757-5151 ext#1 to request a copy. There will also be copies available at the Town Hall Office if you would like to pick one up.

## DISCONTINUATION OF SUMMER SPRINKLER CREDIT

As Greenville continues to rapidly grow we need to look at other methods of water conservation. The motion made in 2001 to allow for discounted rates for summer watering and the filling of swimming pools **has been rescinded** by the Sanitary District Commissioners. As of October 6, 2015 there will **no longer be a summer sprinkler credit**. We are already running water dangerously low and are close to exceeding capacity. Therefore we had no choice but to remove watering forgiveness to preserve water. Many residents take advantage of the discounted rates for summer watering, using valuable drinking water, to do miscellaneous projects around the yard. We are hoping that by discontinuing this process residents will be more cautious of how much water they are using outdoors during the summer months. We encourage more people to use rain barrels or even using sump pump water rather than using drinking water to water their lawns.

Note: We will still allow for the practice of establishing a new lawn with a sprinkler credit of 30,000 gallons and give approximately two months to establish a lawn with new home construction.

# FIRE DEPARTMENT

- Since January 1st the Greenville Fire Department responded to 54 calls for service (as of 4/30/16).
- Since January 1st the Greenville First Responders responded to 106 calls for service (as of 4/30/16).



## SUMMER SAFETY TIPS:

### Barbecue Grills

- Keep grills at least 10 feet from structures/combustibles.
- Never use a grill in a garage or carport.
- Before using a gas grill, check hoses and connections for leaks.
- Check that the venturi tubes-where gas and air mix-are not blocked.
- Consumers should only use propane tanks that have a three-pronged valve: this is a sign that there is an overflow protection device in the tanks.
- When lighting a charcoal grill, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add fluid after the fire is started.
- To dispose of hot coals, soak them with water and stir to make sure the fire is out.
- Never put coals in plastic, wood, or paper containers.
- Wear snug-fitting clothing when grilling.

### Fireworks

- For safety's sake, leave fireworks to the professionals.
- If you do use fireworks, light them outdoors, away from dry grass.
- Only use fireworks permitted by local/state ordinances/laws.
- Always have a bucket of water or a fire extinguisher nearby.
- Never let children light or play with fireworks.

## BIKES, SKATEBOARDS, HORSES, ATVS

One of the best ways to stay safe this summer is to wear a helmet and other safety gear when biking, skating and skateboarding, and when riding scooters, all-terrain vehicles, and horses. Studies on bicycle helmets have shown they can reduce the risk of head injury by as much as 85 percent.

## POOLS AND PONDS

Swimming pool safety includes placing barriers completely around your pool to prevent access, using door and pool alarms, closely supervising your child and being prepared in case of an emergency. Close supervision of children is also needed around the many ponds in Greenville. It's surprising but there are over 100 retention ponds in Greenville.

## YARD/GARAGE

Summer also means yard work. When mowing, keep small children out of the yard, and turn the mower off if children enter the area. If the lawn slopes, mow across the slope with the walk-behind rotary mower, never up and down. With a riding mower, drive up and down the slope, not across it. Never carry children on a riding mower.

As we transition from spring to summer, we know everyone continues to clean up their yards. We usually receive complaints on burning. Please remember the Town has a drop-off site at the Greenville Municipal building for yard waste. The Town also has a brush pick-up program to pick up brush at residential homes. If you do have a fire in your yard, please be aware that some of your neighbors may have health issues with smoke and odors. We currently do not have a burning ordinance, but there is a nuisance ordinance that can be enforced if someone calls to complain about the burning. We ask that you be considerate of your neighbors. Camp fires should be a minimum of 25 feet from any structure. Do not burn if there is a significant wind. Please contact the Fire Department at 757-7262 to notify us of brush fires larger than a standard campfire. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources publication AM-196-96 and NR 429.04 of Wisconsin's Administrative Codes describe what can/cannot be burned by home owners. They allow home owners to burn clean wood/brush and DRY leaves/clippings. Materials that MAY NOT be burned are:

- wet, combustible rubbish, such as wet cardboard or paper
- oily substances, such as oily or greasy rags, oil filters, etc.

- asphalt, such as asphalt shingles or tar paper
- plastics of any kind, including plastic bottles and plastic bags
- rubber products, including tires and hoses

Thank you again and please take advantage of the yard waste drop off site located at W6895 Parkview Dr. (behind the fire station) OR the brush pick-up program. For more details please see the Public Works section of the newsletter. **ADDITIONALLY, COMMERCIAL BUSINESSES, CONTRACTORS, ETC. ARE NOT ALLOWED TO PERFORM ANY KIND OF OPEN BURNING WITHOUT A LICENSE OBTAINED FROM THE DNR.**



# FIRST RESPONDERS

I am sitting here writing this article and thinking it's pretty cold outside for this time of the year. I hope by the time everyone gets this it will have warmed up and summer will be in full swing.

Through the end of April we have responded to 106 calls, that's down from 109 from the same time last year.

The First Responders annual meeting was held on April 18. We held our bi-annual elections for 3 officers this year. Mark Evers was re-elected for EMS Coordinator, Ben Romenesko for Secretary and Josh Lambie elected for Treasurer.

We also finished our training to administer Narcan (a drug that you give to an overdose patient). We can administer when needed, but are waiting for the state approval.

On May 5th at the Go Red for Women banquet we were recognized by the American Heart Association and awarded the Emergency Cardiovascular Care Heart Saver Award. This is a fundraiser for heart disease in women for women's awareness and we are the first volunteer group to be recognized. It is a great honor this award comes from the AHA which is the group that sets the standards for CPR Classes that we take. We have been fortunate enough over the past several years to be able to help out a few patients in cardiac arrest.

With summer just around the corner we know everyone has summer activities to go to, so we have included some helpful tips that hopefully everyone has heard of but never hurts to review.

## BUG SAFETY

- Don't use scented soaps, perfumes or hair sprays on your child.
- Avoid areas where insects nest or congregate, such as stagnant pools of water, uncovered foods and gardens where flowers are in bloom.
- Avoid dressing your child in clothing with bright colors or flowery prints.
- To remove a visible stinger from skin, gently back it out by scraping it with a credit card or your fingernail.
- Combination sunscreen/insect repellent products should be avoided because sunscreen needs to be reapplied every two hours, but the insect repellent should not be reapplied.
- Use insect repellents containing DEET when needed to prevent insect-related diseases. Ticks can transmit Lyme

Disease, and mosquitoes can transmit West Nile, Chikungunya Virus and other viruses.

- The current AAP and CDC recommendation for children older than 2 months of age is to use 10% to 30% DEET. DEET should not be used on children younger than 2 months of age.
- The effectiveness is similar for 10% to 30% DEET but the duration of effect varies. Ten percent DEET provides protection for about 2 hours, and 30% protects for about 5 hours. Choose the lowest concentration that will provide the required length of coverage.
- The concentration of DEET varies significantly from product to product, so read the label of any product you purchase. Children should wash off repellents when they return indoors.
- As an alternative to DEET, picaridin has become available in the U.S. in concentrations of 5% to 10%.
- When outside in the evenings or other times when there are a lot of mosquitoes present, cover up with long sleeved shirts, pants and socks to prevent bites.

## PLAYGROUND SAFETY

- The playground should have safety-tested mats or loose-fill materials (shredded rubber, sand, wood chips, or bark) maintained to a depth of at least 9 inches (6 inches for shredded rubber). The protective surface should be installed at least 6 feet (more for swings and slides) in all directions from the equipment.
- Equipment should be carefully maintained. Open "S" hooks or protruding bolt ends can be hazardous.
- Swing seats should be made of soft materials such as rubber, plastic or canvas.
- Make sure children cannot reach any moving parts that might pinch or trap any body part.
- Never attach—or allow children to attach—ropes, jump ropes, leashes, or similar items to play equipment; children can strangle on these. If you see something tied to the playground, remove it or call the playground operator to remove it.
- Make sure your children remove helmets and anything looped around their necks.
- Metal, rubber and plastic products can get very hot in the summer, especially under direct sun.
- Make sure slides are cool to prevent children's legs from getting burned.
- Do not allow children to play barefoot on the playground.

# FIRST RESPONDERS

- Parents should supervise children on play equipment to make sure they are safe.
- Parents should never purchase a home trampoline or allow children to use a home trampoline because of the risk of serious injury even when supervised.
- Surrounding trampoline netting offers a false sense of security and does not prevent many trampoline-related injuries.
- If children are jumping on a trampoline, they should be supervised by a responsible adult, and only one child should be on the trampoline at a time; 75% of trampoline injuries occur when more than one person is jumping at a time.
- When purchasing a helmet, look for a label or sticker that says the helmet meets the CPSC safety standard.
- A helmet should be worn so that it is level on the head and covers the forehead, not tipped forward or backwards. The strap should be securely fastened with about 2 fingers able to fit between chin and strap. The helmet should be snug on the head, but not overly tight. Skin should move with the helmet when moved side to side. If needed, the helmet's sizing pads can help improve the fit.
- Do not push your child to ride a 2-wheeled bike without training wheels until he or she is ready. Consider the child's coordination and desire to learn to ride. Stick with coaster (foot) brakes until your child is older and more experienced for hand brakes. Consider a balance bike with no pedals for young children to learn riding skills.

## BICYCLE SAFETY

- A helmet protects your child from serious injury, and should always be worn, and remember, wearing a helmet at all times helps children develop the helmet habit.
- Your child needs to wear a helmet on every bike ride, no matter how short or how close to home. Many injuries happen in driveways, on sidewalks, and on bike paths, not just on streets. Children learn best by observing you. Set the example: Whenever you ride, put on your helmet.
- Take your child with you when you shop for the bike, so that he or she can try it out. The value of a properly fitted bike far outweighs the value of surprising your child with a new one. Buy a bike that is the right size, not one your child has to "grow into." Oversized bikes are especially dangerous.

# FIRST RESPONDERS

## SKATEBOARD, SCOOTER, IN-LINE SKATING AND HEELYS SAFETY

- All skateboarders and scooter-riders should wear protective gear; helmets are particularly important for preventing and minimizing head injuries. Riders should wear helmets that meet ASTM or other approved safety standards, and that are specifically designed to reduce the effects of skating hazards.
- Communities should continue to develop skateboard parks, which are more likely to be monitored for safety than ramps and jumps constructed by children at home.
- While in-line skating or using Heelys, only skate on designated paths or rinks and not in the street.
- Most injuries occur due to falls. Inexperienced riders should only ride as fast as they can comfortably slow down, and they should practice falling on grass or other soft surfaces. Before riding, skateboarders should survey the riding terrain for obstacles such as potholes, rocks, or any debris. Protective wrist, elbow and kneepads should be worn.
- Children should never ride skateboards or scooters in or near moving traffic.
- Riders should never skate alone. Children under the age of eight should be closely supervised at all times.

Also as a reminder to all parents and children alike. Please obey the laws when walking or biking on the of roadways without sidewalks. Greenville has a very good trail system

but if you can't use them remember these rules:

- Always stay on the shoulder.
- Walk with traffic coming towards you.
- Bike with the traffic.
- Walk and bike single file.
- Wear some kind of reflective clothing.
- Avoid walking and biking when it is dark.

We are hoping to see a lot of residents at the many summer activities that Greenville has to offer. Some of these include the Friday night Catfish races and Saturday night concert, the Greenville Town parade, the bike giveaway and The Bill Tesch Memorial Concert are just a few. We hope you can come and join in the fun. These activities are run by our local groups that give back to our community, so please come out to support them. It also gives us the Greenville First Responders a chance to meet you and try to answer any questions you may have. At some of the events we are able to bring some of our equipment and we get to share some of our educational handouts with you.

In closing, we the First Responders want to thank the Greenville Lions, the Greenville Lioness and the Greenville Women's Club for all of their generous donations and they're continued support through the past years.

Let's talk barking.....

Barking has taken over as the most complained about animal ordinance violation. I have responded to over 100 barking complaints since the first of the year. Barking problems are not just happening in one or two areas, but all across Town.

Our ordinance is clear on what constitutes nuisance barking; "barks, whines or howls in an excessive, continuous or untimely fashion".

Once you have allowed your dog to develop this less than desirable behavior it is difficult to fix it, but not impossible.

If you have had a visit, call or letter from me with regards to a barking dog complaint and continue to struggle with your dog's barking please contact me as I have some resources that may be able to help.

Understand that excessive barking is a citable ordinance violation.

I have also received a number of phone calls from people concerned about dogs being allowed to run off leash on the dead end road by the Special Memories Zoo. I understand that it's nice to let your dog off his/her leash to run but we do have a leash ordinance and I ask that you adhere to it.

Many of these free running dogs are approaching the zoo animals and startling and frightening them. This causes undue stress and in some cases, illness to some of these animals. They are also defecating on zoo property and in the road and the feces is NOT being picked up.

Again, I would ask that you take the time to read our Animal ordinances. They can be found on the Town website, [townofgreenville.com](http://townofgreenville.com). Animal ordinances are found under Part II – General Legislation, Chapter 76.

If you have any questions regarding our Town animal ordinances, please contact me.

The story this issue is one that is very dear to my heart. It has been a year in the making and I hope you will find it as touching as I do. It is a condensed version of the whole story. It is a story about how determination, care, compassion and teamwork came together to save the lives of 2 amazing dogs.....

It was just over a year ago that I received a call from one of our wonderful 9-1-1 Dispatchers looking for some guidance. Her father had recently passed away and left behind 2 dogs

who had been living outdoors for about 9 years. Neither dog was very socialized. The only human contact they had had were that of their owner and once in a while visitors.

Curt and Jenny were able to approach the dogs just long enough to feed them. The shelter in their area was not able to take the dogs and a dog behaviorist recommended euthanasia. But Jenny and Curt saw something in both dogs and were determined to give them every possible chance. It was then that they called and asked if I had any suggestions.

I sat down with Deb Lewis and staff at FVHA and laid out the situation. It was agreed that if Jenny and Curt thought the dogs deserved a chance then we, as a team, were going to help. Over the next several months Curt was able to gain the trust of Marshall & Tucker to the degree that 3 FVHA staff members could go out to the dogs, draw blood for necessary testing and give them vaccines. It took time and patience but the trip was successful. Tuckers bloodwork showed nothing abnormal but Marshalls confirmed Lyme's disease, although he was showing no symptoms.

The next step was to get them to trust enough to go for a car ride to the shelter for a full exam. Curt and Jenny took it slow, starting with short walks outside the kennel then working up to short rides in the car. Another few months had gone by when they felt the boys were ready to try the trip to Appleton.

Upon arrival at the shelter things were taken very slowly as the car ride had stressed them out a bit. It took some coaxing to get them into the shelter and once in, they were nervous. Again, time and patience combined with Curt and Jenny's presence, led to success.

Both boys appeared to be in pretty good health with the exception of a lump that was found on Tucker. A biopsy of the lump was taken and it would be 24 long hours before the results would be available. I swear the whole shelter staff was nervous awaiting the results. We couldn't even imagine what Curt and Jenny were feeling. Finally the results were back and to our great disappointment confirmed what the FVHA vets had thought, Tucker had cancer. It was heart wrenching to pass along this news to Curt and Jenny. Tears were shed all around. But, the wonderful Dr. Laura Nelson, DVM along with the equally wonderful Dr. Kate Bard, DVM gave Curt and Jenny some optimistic news. They could do surgery and would hopefully be able to remove all of the mast cell tumor.

Both dogs had come so far and Curt and Jenny knew that Marshall would be lost without Tucker. They felt they had to

take the chance that the surgery would be successful.

Tucker came through surgery well and both Dr.'s felt that they had gotten all of the tumor. The future for Tucker was now looking brighter.

Throughout the next 6 months Marshall and Tucker were slowly introduced to the other 2 dogs that they would hopefully be living with soon. Keep in mind that they had lived outside most of their lives. During this time the boys visited FVHA several times. It was exciting to see the progress that they were making. Each time they came in they were a little less nervous than the time before.

Through the winter we received regular progress reports on the dogs, who were now living inside with Curt and Jenny and the 2 dogs.

In February of this year I received a call from Jenny. She stated that Tucker had another lump and Marshall was having difficulty eating. The staff were cautiously optimistic on the day that the boys were brought in to address these new

issues. It was found that Marshall had an ulcer on his tongue that had begun to heal with dog hair in it. It was causing him pain and making it difficult to eat. The vet staff gave his teeth a good cleaning and removed the hairs from the wound. Marshall would be back to his old, new self in no time.

Tucker's lump was examined and the vet staff was happy to report it was only a fatty mass, which most dogs develop in their senior years.

As of this writing Marshall and Tucker are healthy, happy and living the good life that all dogs deserve, with the 2 most amazing people who were willing to take a chance on them and committed to being in it for the long haul.

Enjoy the warm weather, it won't last long and I leave you with this..... "I can't think of anything more rewarding than making the last years of a pets life the best that they can be."

## TREE CITY USA

The Town of Greenville has been designated as a Tree City USA community for 15 years now. To qualify as a Tree City USA community, a Town or city must meet four standards established by The Arbor Day Foundation. These four standards are a Tree Board or Department, a tree care ordinance, a Community Forestry Program with an annual budget of at least \$2 per capita, and an Arbor Day Observance and Proclamation.

## STREET TREES

Street trees are planted during the spring on lots that have an established lawn. If you received trees in front of your home, please help us care for them by keeping them watered during the summer. You should have received a letter along with a care sheet earlier this spring. If you didn't or need another copy please contact us and we will get another copy to you. This year we are installing Tree Gator Irrigation Bags on all new street tree plantings. Keeping the tree properly watered is very important for the establishment of these young trees but remember that over watering can kill a tree just as easily as under watering. If you received a tree last year, please continue to water it as well. All we ask is that you water and keep the tree mulched. All other maintenance such as pruning, staking or fertilizing will be done by Town staff. If you have any questions or concerns about your tree please feel free to give us a call.

## NEIGHBORHOOD TREE PROGRAM

The Greenville Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department has a program that allows homeowners to help fill in street tree locations in the new subdivisions with curb and gutter. The funding for the street trees in many of the current subdivisions was provided by fees that were collected on a per lot basis at the time a building permit was issued. Depending on the subdivision, this fee may or may not provide enough funding to completely line the streets with trees, leaving some vacant planting sites. The neighborhood tree program provides homeowners the opportunity to fill in these vacant locations. The homeowner pays for the cost of the tree while the Town will pick up the cost of the planting. The trees will be planted during the spring along with the normal street tree planting. Give us a call to learn more.

## LANDSCAPING IN THE RIGHT OF WAY

The Town of Greenville has an ordinance that regulates landscaping within the Town right of way. This ordinance requires that a permit be obtained if one desires to perform any landscaping activities within the Town right of way. The Town right of way typically extends 33' out from the centerline of the road which usually amounts to 15' from the curb. If you are unsure of the location of the right of way, please contact Town Hall. This ordinance only applies to subdivisions with curb and gutter. Landscaping is still prohibited in any Town ditch. In order to receive a permit, one must fill out an application and submit a landscape plan that adheres to the regulations set forth by the ordinance. If you are planning to do any landscaping in the right of way, please stop by Town Hall and pick up a permit application

and a copy of the ordinance. This may also be viewed on the Town Website. Violators of this ordinance will be subject to a fine and removal of any landscaping that violates the regulations set forth by this ordinance.

## URBAN FORESTRY BOARD

The Greenville Urban Forestry Board currently has open positions available on the board. The Urban Forestry Board is a group of residents that oversee the operation of Greenville's Urban Forestry program. The Board plans and implements tree planting projects in Town, oversees the forestry budget, provides forestry education to the public, etc. Meetings are held at the Town Hall on the second Thursday of months of January, March, May, July, September and November at 6:30 pm. If you are interested in a position on the Urban Forestry Board, join us at a meeting or contact Tony Nowak, Director of Parks and Forestry for more information.

# Memorial Tree and Bench Program



This program provides the opportunity to donate a park bench or tree in honor or memory of a loved one. These benches or trees may be placed at any of the parks or along the trail system. Your donation to this program will not only provide a lasting memory but also help to beautify our parks and trails.



## Tree Program






